ACCEPTABLE USE POLICY

Mercy Primary School, Birr, Co. Offaly.

The aim of this Internet Acceptable Use Policy, (AUP) is to ensure that pupils will benefit from learning opportunities offered by the school's Internet resources in a safe and effective manner. Internet use and access is considered a school resource and privilege. Therefore, if the school AUP is not adhered to, this privilege will be withdrawn and appropriate sanctions, as outlined in the AUP, will be imposed.

It is envisaged that school and parent representatives will revise the AUP periodically. Before signing the Registration Form the AUP should be read carefully to ensure that the conditions of use are accepted and understood.

School's Strategy

The school will employ a number of strategies in order to maximise learning opportunities and reduce risks associated with the Internet. These strategies are as follows:

General

- Internet sessions will always be supervised by a teacher.
- Filtering software will be used in order to minimise the risk of exposure to inappropriate material.
- The school will monitor pupils Internet usage.
- Students and teachers will be provided with training in the area of Internet safety.
- Uploading and downloading of non-approved software will not be permitted.
- Virus protection software will be used and updated on a regular basis.
- Students will observe good 'netiquette' (i.e., etiquette on the Internet) at all times and will not undertake any actions that may bring the school into disrepute.

World Wide Web

- Students will not visit Internet sites that contain obscene, illegal, hateful or otherwise objectionable materials.
- Students will use the Internet for educational purposes only.
- Students will be familiar with copyright issues relating to online learning.
- Students will never disclose or publicise personal information.
- Students will be aware that any usage, including distributing or receiving information, school related or personal, may be monitored for unusual activity, security and/or network management.

Email

- Students will use approved class email accounts under supervision by or permission from a teacher.
- Students will not send or receive any material that is illegal, obscene, defamatory or that is intended to annoy or intimidate another person.
- Students will not reveal their own or other peoples personal details such as addresses or telephone numbers or pictures.
- Students will never arrange face-to-face meeting with someone they only know through emails or the internet.
- Students will note that sending or receiving attachments is subject to permission from their teacher.

Internet Chat

- Students will only have access to discussion for or other electronic communication for a that have been approved by the school.
- Discussion for or other electronic communication for a will always be supervised.
- Usernames will be used to avoid disclosure of identity.
- Face-to-face meetings with someone organised via Internet chat will be allowed only under teacher direction for specific projects.

School Website

In the event of the school establishing a school website

- Pupils will be given the opportunity to publish projects, artwork or school work on the World Wide Web.
- The publication of student work will be co-ordinated by a teacher.
- Pupil's work will appear in an educational context on Web pages with a copyright notice prohibiting the copying of such work without express written permission.
- Digital Photographs, audio or video clips of individual students will not be published on the school website. Instead photographs, audio and video clips will focus on group activities. Video clips may be password protected.
- Personal pupil information including home address and contact details will be omitted from school web pages.
- Pupils will continue to own the copyright on any work published.

Sanctions

Misuse of the Internet may result in disciplinary action, including written warnings, withdrawal of access privileges and, in extreme cases suspension. The school also reserves the right to report any illegal activities to the appropriate authorities.
