Describing a Setting

Today we are going to describe a variety of settings depending on what type of story we are writing. I will give you a few to chose from, and we will use adjectives to describe them. When you have written a few sentences, you can then draw a picture to finish it.

- 1. A forest
- 2. A Cottage
- 3. A School

Addition with Renaming:

Remember:


When we are adding:

- With TENS and UNITS,
 you need 10 of any object
 to make a full group.
- Any 'leftovers' that can't make a full group are what we call out UNITS.

This week girls, we are going to learn to addition with renaming. This is just a fancy way of saying, when we are adding, we keep the TENS together and the UNITS together. To practice this, we will try to regroup sets of objects that have a

Have a look at this example:


1. These buns need to be regrouped. There are 16 buns in total. How many TENS can we make? How many UNITS will we have left over?



There were 6 left over.
There aren't enough to make another TEN so I have 6 UNITS

Now have a look at this example:

I have 2 tens and 11 units. Can you regroup them for me?



- 1. Look at how many units you have.
- 2. Circle a ten.
- 3. How many TENS do you have now?
- 4. How many UNITS do you have now?

2 tens and 111 units = 3 tens and 1 unit

SESE

This week, we are going to do some work on Sounds. Today we are going to have a look at sounds around our home. We will use our Unlocking SESE workbooks, which would have focused on sounds in the school, but we can use our homes instead, if that is easier ©

- You can choose to draw pictures about places/things that make loud and soft sounds either at home or in school.
- If you want you can split the box in half and do both places.
- Try and come up with 6pictures ©



Addition with Renaming

tens

Today we are going to take what we have learned about regrouping, and try the same concept with Standing Up sums. The key is just to remember that TENS stay with TENS and UNITS stay with UNITS © Have a try of page 140 in your Planet Maths!

Have a look at this Example:


$$5 + 7 = 12$$

We can't put 12 under the UNITS because there is a TEN in it.

We put the UNITS under the line.

WE must take the TEN and put it back above the line with the other TENS.

Then we can add all the TENS together!





Now you can choose an activity to do! You could draw a picture, play a board game, write a story in your free writing copy, or any fun activity that you like to do!




Take your blank sheet and practice drawing your own Summer scene, labelling the items with the new vocabulary that I have written in.

What you need

- · A cardboard tube
- Greaseproof paper

- · Coloured paper
- · Rubber bands
- Crayons and markers
- Glue or sticky tape
- Scissors

Plurals

Today, we will look at Plurals!

A plural means that there are more than one of any object!

For example:

Dog - dogs Brush - brushes

Today we are going to look at words that get an /es/.



Have a look at page 59 in your Jolly Grammar.

Choose a noun that ends in /ch/, /s/, /x/.

These endings always get /es/ when they become a plural.


Some examples of Nouns you can use are: lunch, box, glass ©

Problem Solving

Today, we are going to continue our work on Adding with Renaming. We will use our Planet Maths again today ©

Remember

- 1. Start with your UNITS
- 2. When you add them together, put the UNITS under the line and the TENS back above the line with the other TENS.
- 3. Then add your TENS together and put your answer under the line ©


Maths: One last Addition activity in your Planet Maths book on page 142.
