I am really missing working and playing with all of the girls. You can cut me out and take pictures of me with you as you do work, play inside or outside, or with anything you do during the week.


















Monday

Choose your favourite character and setting and describe them together:










It might help to think of these things while you are describing your character in your setting

Fractions:



Write the words you choose into your Try it Space ☺


Fractions



Now you can choose an activity to do! You could draw a picture, play a board game, write a story in your free writing copy, or any fun activity that you like to do!



Draw yourself travelling over your home in a hot air balloon. Today we are going to learn about Hot Air Balloons in History. WE are very lucky here in Birr, that for the last few years we have been able to see the Hot Air Balloon Festival in the castle. And only a few months ago, we got to see a hot air balloon in our school yard ©

On 19th September 1783, the Montgolfier Brothers in France, flew a Hot Air Balloon successfully for King Louis and Queen Marie Antoinette. There were no men in the balloon, but it did have a sheep, a duck, and a rooster.

On the 21st November 1783 the Montgolfier brothers successfully flew a hot air balloon in Paris with two men on board.

The first Irish person to fly a hot air balloon was Richard Crosbie. Between 1785 and 1786, he flew four times in Dublin and Limerick.




Fractions


