Settings ©



For example: the zoo, the beach, a forest, a magical land, a fairy house, your own house, the school, a haunted house, or on an aeroplane/train/bus.




















Fractions:

This week ladies, we are going to continue working on Fractions. I am going to give you a number of word problems that I would like you to try in your copies. You don't need to write the question, just the answer. Sometimes drawing a picture can help (don't worry about the ones with big numbers though \mathfrak{G}).

- 1. Lily has 18 sweets. She gives half to her sister? How many does her sister have?
- 2. Dean buys a punnet of 30 strawberries. He eats half on the way home from the shop. How many are left in the bag?
- 3. Sophie counts 40 apples on a tree. Her mother picks half of them to bake an apple tart. How many were left on the tree?
- 4. 16 birds landed on a tree. Half flew down to find food. How many went to find food?
- 5. There are 20 squares in a large chocolate bar. Tom and Laura got half each. How many squares did they get?
- 6. Maura buys 12 eggs in the shop. She only needs half to bake a cake. How many eggs does she need for the cake?





Fractions


Today I am going to show you five images, each with a different set of numbers. I would like you to try and create a word problem to represent each picture ©
















For Example:



Long ago, there was an inversor colled Doedalus. He lived on the Island of Crete with his son loaus.



Up and Down


