Tuesday



Today, we are going to learn a little bit about the ship, the Titanic. When you have read the information, you can try and complete page 115 in your Unlocking SESE ☺

At the time, the Titanic was the largest ship ever built, and it took three years to make. It was built at the Harland and Wolff shipyard in Belfast in Northern Ireland.

The Titanic was as long as three football pitches and as high as a building with 17 storeys. People said the Titanic was so amazing it would never sink.

Not all cabins on the Titanic were the same. People with lots of money travelled first class. Second class passengers had a library and their own walking areas on the ship called promenades. People who travelled in third class usually didn't have much money. The cabins were near the ship's engines so could be noisy. There were only two baths between 700 people! Third class passengers weren't allowed to go in the first or second class areas.

On the Titanic's first journey, the weather was really cold. There were icebergs in the sea. One night, the ship hit an iceberg. It made a very big hole and the Titanic began to fill with water.

As the Titanic started to sink, people began to get into lifeboats. The problem was, there weren't enough lifeboats for everyone on board the Titanic.

A few hours after the Titanic hit the iceberg, it sank to the bottom of the sea. The people in the lifeboats waited in the freezing cold to be rescued.

For many years, people didn't know where the Titanic had sunk. People went deep sea diving to try to find the ship. Then a man called Robert Ballard found the Titanic. He discovered that the ship had broken into two pieces. Today, people can go on special trips down to see the wreck of the Titanic.




Now you can choose an activity to do! You could draw a picture, play a board game, write a story in your free writing copy, or any fun activity that you like to do!

passengers from one place to another. I make sure everything is working on the ferry and that the weather is safe to travel in.




name is Nikolajs and I work on a

How are boats used in your area?






Thursday Money


