$$10-7=3$$

Bert made 16 bags of toffee for the market. Later, he made 21 bags of fudge. How many bags did he make to sell at the market?

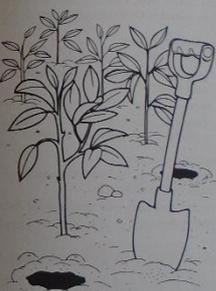


NUMBER PROBLEMS 3
