Maths:


I have attached a maths story with questions. I've also attached some challenge cards with it.

Set up a sequence of linked events so that an initial movement in your creation leads to another and then another.


Competition – Which sequence contains the most linked events?

SPHE:


Continue to write down something good about every day and something good about yourself.
